I write to inform you that we will have strict book collection arrangements in place for the pending English Literature examinations.

On **Thursday 23 May 2019**, your child will be sitting the English Literature (Paper 1 - 9ETO/01) examination and will need to hand in both Literature texts on their way into the exam hall. All parents/carers will be invoiced for missing texts at the following costs:

"King Lear"	Cost £6.00
"A Streetcar Named Desire"	Cost £7.00

In the event your child would like to return their tragedy anthology, this would be very much welcomed. These are free and provided by the exam board for every candidate, so we do not necessarily need these back. If you would like to donate any literature guides back to the school, please ensure your child hands these into the book collection boxes. It might be a good way of decluttering once this first examination has been undertaken to focus the mind on the second examination.

On **Monday 3 June 2019**, your child will be sitting the English Literature (Paper 2 - 9ETO/02) examination and will need to hand in their prose texts as they leave the exam hall. All parents/carers will be invoiced for missing texts at the following costs:

"Beloved"	Cost £8.00
"The Picture of Dorian Gray"	Cost £3.00

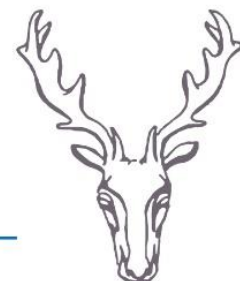
On **Tuesday 11 June 2019**, your child will be sitting the English Literature (Paper 3 - 9ETO/03) examination and will need to hand in their poetry texts as they leave the exam hall. All parents/carers will be invoiced for missing texts at the following costs:

"The Wife of Bath's Prologue and Tale"	Cost £6.00
"Poems of the Decade"	Cost £6.00

The coursework texts should have already been returned to the class teacher so that they could amend their records accordingly, showing that your child has returned the books that were loaned.
